New "Official" Newspaper

Prosecuting Attorney Cannon reviewed what the Idaho Code requires for a newspaper to be designated the "Official" newspaper for publishing the County's legal notices. Since the Minidoka County News was closed, the County must now designate a new "Official" newspaper. Based on the "paid circulation" figures that were provided by

the Times-News, the Board unanimously approved a **MOTION** to designate the South Idaho Press as the “Official” newspaper for Minidoka County.
