The Board discussed the Cassia County letter that outlined their support for the Mini-Cassia Commerce Authority's plans to hire an independent consultant. The Board unanimously approved a MOTION to provide financial support of \$500/month for five months beginning April 1, 2009.

Ken Robinette and Mandi Badger, representing South Central Community Action Partnership, appeared before the board to review their 2008 Annual Report. Their information illustrated the number of residents that received their services and the value of the services.

Sheriff Deputies Watson and Kindig, along with Prosecuting Attorney Stevenson, met with the Board to discuss Minidoka County's involvement with the Burley Regatta. The Board was informed that the Sheriff's Department will continue to provide security on the river. There should be no issue with this service since the expense is being covered by Waterways Fund money and not county tax dollars.

The Board unanimously approved a MOTION to approved the contract between Prosecuting Attorney Stevenson and the City of Paul for the prosecution of city misdemeanors. The City will pay \$187.50 per month beginning October 1, 2009.

Kathy Uker, representing Region IV Development Association (RIVDA) met with the Board to discuss the Idaho Community Development Block Grant for the County Fire District. The Board unanimously approved a MOTION to enter into a Professional Services Contract with RIVDA to provide administrative services relating to the Fire District's grant.
