



MINIDOKA COUNTY
COMMISSIONER MEETING
MINUTES

May 30, 2023

The meeting was opened with the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer at 10:30 a.m.

Present for this meeting were: Commissioner Schenk, Commissioner Schaeffer, Commissioner Orton, Clerk Page, and Deputy Clerk Ramsey.

Public present were: Vicki Vandever, Breyanna Fairchild, Julie Evensen, Jennie Bateman, Kade Bateman and Paul Ross.

The planning of the 2026 Semiquincentennial commemoration of the Declaration of Independence Resolution was discussed. There will be a committee meeting on June 7th at 7 p.m. at the Wilson Theater to begin the planning.

Commissioner Schaeffer **moved to sign resolution #2023-05-30**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Sheriff Pinther presented the city contracts for law enforcement support with the City of Paul and Communication support with the cities of Heyburn and Rupert.

Commissioner Orton **moved to sign the City of Paul law enforcement support contract for FY24 beginning October 1, 2023 in the amount of \$54,550.00** for the provisions set forth in the contract, with a second voiced by Commissioner Schaeffer. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schaeffer **moved to sign the communication support contract with the City of Heyburn in the amount of \$52,818.76**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Commissioner Orton **moved to sign the communication support contract with the City of Rupert in the amount of \$81,104.84**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Schaeffer. Motion carried.

Lieutenant Cobbley presented three titles to be signed over to purchase two Suzuki 750 ATV's and one Can Am youth ATV.

Commissioner Orton **moved to sign three titles: #124011839 – 2012 Suzuki ATV LTA500, VIN #5SAAM45P2C7101884 – #210182066 – 2009 KTM Motorcycle, VIN #VBKKWH2329M121300, and #134013439 2013 Suzuki ATV LTA500X VIN #5SAAM45P5D7103503**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Schaeffer. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schaeffer **moved to approve payroll and claims as presented**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the motion from May 22, 2023 to verify the start date for the EMPG stipend increase. Commissioner Schenk **moved to increase the EMPG stipend out of the current grant for the remainder of FY23 starting June 1st, and continue at that amount with the FY24 grant**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Schaeffer. Motion carried.

9:12 a.m. Commissioner Schaeffer **moved to go into executive session**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Roll call vote was taken: Commissioner Schaeffer aye; Commissioner Orton Aye; Commissioner Schenk aye. Motion carried. Exited Executive Session at 9:26 a.m.

Procurement office Faux reported on: Foam insulation in the Clerk's office; sheet rock and drop ceiling will be in this week; and then painters.

Budgets were discussed.

Buildings and Grounds Director Thomson reported on: 911 generator had two or three alarms; working on the service contract with CAT; Treasurer door and code is in; air conditioning unit on Juvenile Probation building failed, got it repaired; and the Duane Smith annex and the south complex have leaky roofs. He also reported that Jacoby quit, so he temporarily hired his daughter Asha.

Meeting adjourned at 10:36 a.m.


