



## MINIDOKA COUNTY COMMISSIONER MEETING MINUTES

June 1, 2021

The meeting was opened with the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer at 8:30 A.M.

Present for this meeting were: Commissioner Schenk, Commissioner McClellan, Commissioner Koyle, Deputy Clerk Ramsey and Deputy Clerk McCall. Clerk Page and Prosecutor Stevenson were excused.

Public present: Chris Schenk, Dennis Schenk, Building Admin Brett Stephens, Kris Christensen, Robert Griffin and Jennie Bateman.

Commissioners held a discussion on the RV ordinance. Chris Schenk and Kris Christensen presented before the board to discuss their concerns on the RV ordinance. Building Admin Stephens explained the current RV ordinance and state statute defining recreational vehicles. Commissioner Schenk addressed the situation in the county and asked for suggestions from the public present on how to change the current ordinance. Commissioner McClellan would like to get suggestions also from Planning and Zoning and explained the ordinance process and that it takes time.

Building Admin Stephens presented the Chevrolet Impala title to be signed by the Commissioners. Commissioner Schenk **moved to sign the title for the Chevrolet Impala** Serial No. 2G1WB5E31F1158373 that was traded in for the new pickup for the building department with a second voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried. Commissioner Schenk **moved to approve the payment for the new pickup to Young Automotive** Serial No. 1C6RR7FGXMS537826 for the amount of \$13,970.00 with a second voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried.

Building Admin Stephens presented before the board to discuss hiring an additional building inspector in August or September. He also presented a change in salary to come out of his extra help line in his budget because of the extra work load to be approved in today's payroll.

Commissioner Schenk **moved to approve claims and payroll as presented** with a second voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried.

Commissioner Koyle **moved to approve the minutes from May 24, 2021**, with two corrections with a second voiced by Commissioner Schenk. Motion carried.

Board reviewed correspondence: two letters from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission re: designation for non-federal representative to conduct informal consultation.

Connie Stopher gave an update on the Southern Idaho Economic Development activities for the past year and some new activities that they are pursuing. Rebecca Wildman representing Business Plus and Dan Hoover representing PMT were also in attendance and presented before the Board. Ms. Stopher also requested the annual funding from the county. The new budget for FY2021-2022 has not yet been approved. Commissioners agreed to get the funding approved on their next meeting on June 14<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioners discussed the value of the 1988 Dodge Dakota pickup. Commissioner Schenk moved to put a value of \$225.00 on the 1988 Dodge Dakota as offered by Jalopy Jungle and offer the pickup to county employees for \$225.00 and if more than one employee is interested, the names will be entered into a drawing which will be held on June 14<sup>th</sup> with a second voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried.

The Board held a discussion on the property that is currently being rented by the Minidoka County Beet Growers Association. The Beet Growers would like to do some clean up on the property and requested the county to provide some seed. The current lease is \$1000.00 annually. The Board would like to place the lease on the agenda for June 14<sup>th</sup> as an action item as they want to make some changes.

Commissioners gave their weekly reports.
