



## MINIDOKA COUNTY COMMISSIONER MEETING MINUTES

Aug 15, 2022

The meeting was opened with the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer at 8:30 A.M.

Present for this meeting were: Commissioner Schenk, Commissioner McClellan, Commissioner Orton, Prosecutor Stevenson, Clerk Page and Deputy Clerk Ramsey. Prosecutor Stevenson left the meeting at 9:45 a.m.

Public present: Anna Strauch, Judy Remsberg, John Remsberg, Ryn Severe, Trevor Bott, Bret Andersen, Dean Dimond, Eden Dimond, Kristen Faux, Jennie Bateman, Krystal Young.

Commissioner McClellan presented a plaque of appreciation to the Remsberg family and had them sign the gift deed. Mr. Remsberg requested that the equipment be left in the antique shape it is in. He also presented us a list of the equipment in the building, he will get an appraisal for the Historical Society, who will manage the equipment in the building.

Tye Thompsons report: District Court air conditioner; old Assessor office needs to be maintained because of electronics; and ADA discussion was held.

9:43 a.m. A five-minute break was taken.

Commissioner Schenk moved to **approve claims and payroll as presented**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schenk moved to **approve the minutes of August 8, 2022**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

ARPA discussion was held.

Commissioner Schenk **moved to approve 19 certificates of residency and held 4 for further review, for junior college**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the future of Emerald Lake and City of Heyburn.

There were two proposals received for the Conflict Public Defender position. August 29<sup>th</sup> the Board will offer a contract to the lowest proposal.

Commissioner Schenk **moved to re-appoint David Molina and Lauren West to the Minidoka Memorial Hospital trustee board**, with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Prosecutor Stevenson presented a resolution to the board regarding Lava Ridge.

Dean Dimond addressed the Board asking for a resolution against Lava Ridge. Commissioner Schenk **moved to approve resolution #2022-8-15** with a second voiced by Commissioner Orton. Motion carried.

Areas of responsibility were reviewed. Commissioner Schenk **moved to appoint Commissioner Orton to the areas of responsibility previously held by Commissioner Koyle until January 2023**, when the list will be reviewed again, with a second voiced by Commissioner McClellan. Motion carried.

There was a wording change on the Serenity River Estates, moved to a future date to be signed.

Planning and Zoning Admin Stephens presented the fee increase for software Citizenserve that his department currently uses. Admin Stephens presented a quote from IWORQ. Admin Stephens will call the City and Counties currently using this software and look into it for 2023.

IT Director Stevens report: generator update, met with electricians on outage time; VM Ware is continually getting patched; new mail systems; CISA remote testing; and primary firewall.

Juvenile probation building repair timeline discussion. Dixie Tate, Ty Thompson, and Edward Stevens were in attendance for this discussion: Ty Thompson will coordinate with all the contractors and staff; Commissioner Schenk will oversee with Ty; and next week, come back with future production dates.

Clerk Page reported that Commissioner Koyle wrote up a nomination, for John Remsberg, for the H. Sydney Duncombe Award.

Prosecutor Stevenson reported that: there was a lot of crime over the weekend; Prosecutor convention was good; there is a shortage of attorneys;


Commissioner Schenk reported on: Solid waste fee report; and the jail roof bid.


