



## MINIDOKA COUNTY COMMISSIONER MEETING MINUTES

August 19, 2019

The meeting was opened at 8:30 AM with **The Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer.**

Present for this meeting were: Commissioner McClellan, Commissioner Koyle, Commissioner Schenk, Prosecuting Attorney Stevenson, Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Goodman, and Deputy Clerk McCall.

Deputy Clerk Dockstader presented **Applications for County Aid.**

2019-66 Commissioner Schenk moved to approve dates of service 4-26-19 and 4-27-2019 with a reimbursement of ½ tax refunds and to reevaluate in 6 months with a second voiced by Commissioner McClellan. Motion carried.

2019-111 Commissioner Koyle moved to approve the application with no reimbursement with a second voiced by Commissioner Schenk. Motion carried.

2019-112 Commissioner Schenk moved to deny due to the applicant's inability to pay next month's rent. If the county were to provide assistance and if the applicant is able to pay next month's billing, then Minidoka County may help an applicant on the grounds that the applicant is capable of providing for him/herself. However, if the applicant is unable to provide for him/herself than Minidoka County cannot help prolong the situation. A second was voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried.

Board of Commissioners signed Satisfaction of Lien for Case 2011-59.

Buildings & Grounds Admin. Thomson presented before the Board to give his **weekly update.** Discussion on: the new bids for removal of trees in front of the courthouse and vehicle purchase. He has found a vehicle that he feels will work well for him. Commissioners were in agreement that he should go test drive it and check it out to make sure it is what he wants.

Coroner Bourn presented before the Board to give **vehicle purchase** information. Board would like him to keep looking as they have only allocated \$10,000. Board will put back on the agenda for next week.

Commissioner Koyle moved to approve the **minutes** for August 12, 2019 with one correction with a second voiced by Commissioner Schenk. Motion carried.

Jared Ricks with the Public Defense Commission introduced himself as the new representative for District 5 replacing Briann McCoy. He is also the representative for Districts 6 and 7. He is looking forward to working with the county and fielded several questions and took some notes.

Ken and Tom Robirds presented before the board on the clean-up of their property. Prosecutor Stevenson has driven by and looks like they are actively working on removal. Prosecutor Stevenson made arrangements to go out and do a walk through on the property and will report back to the commissioners at next week's board meeting.

Prosecutor Stevenson reported on the training he attended last week.

Commissioner Schenk moved to approve the **claims and payroll** as presented with a second voiced by Commissioner Koyle. Motion carried.

Commissioner Koyle moved to approve the **Certificates of Residency** as presented except three; one that was previously approved last week that has met the lifetime limit and two Certificates of Residency presented today that have also reached the lifetime limit with a second voiced by Commissioner Schenk. Motion carried.
