
Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 9.0% since 2017, growing by 1,871. Population is expected to increase by 11.9% between 2022 and 2027, adding 2,680.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 7.3% in Minidoka County, ID from 8,926 to 9,574. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 2.4% by 4.9%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 69.4% to 71.8% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, 7.3% of Minidoka County, ID residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (13.5% below the national average), and 9.4% hold an Associate's Degree (0.6% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Crop Production, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.





Job Trends





Industry Growth


